By **CONNECTING** deaf people with our delivery partners, making it easier for everyone to access sport and physical activity.

PROMOTING, ADVOCATING and **CELEBRATING** the power of sport and success for deaf people across Wales and beyond.




Gathering & sharing the **INSIGHT** to help inform our partners how to better engage and deliver opportunities for deaf people across Wales.

LEADING with integrity



LEAD change and strive for continuous improvement by:

- Reviewing the governance of Wales Deaf Sport, aligning its practise to the expectations of the Governance and Leadership framework for sport in Wales.
- Evolving Wales Deaf Sport into a skills based, high performing, national strategic advisory board.
- Appointing Trustees and Special Advisors to the board of Wales Deaf Sport from key stakeholders to support the strategic direction, purpose and connectivity of the organisation.
- Resourcing and appointing an Executive Lead role to drive the implementation of the strategic plan and business of Wales Deaf Sports.
- Establishing sub-groups which can help deliver the strategy E.g. Community / Performance / Advocacy & Communications / Business, Safeguarding, Welfare & Risk.
- Engaging with UK Deaf Sport governance & operational structures including affiliation to UK Deaf Sport and alignment with the proposed 4Nations group and UK Deaf Sports Participation and Performance groups.
- Supporting positive inclusion and help with the transition of our deaf specific sports organisations into membership of mainstream National Governing Bodies.
- Agreeing & monitoring programme targets aligned to the delivery of the first 4-year strategy.
- Identifying and developing sufficient resources to deliver the strategy.
- Working toward meeting Sport Wales's governance Capability Framework.
- Contributing to shaping future public policy for deaf people in Wales to help support the delivery of our Vision.

A highly respected national organisation that is trusted to lead from the front.

GROWING opportunities



ENABLE our partners to provide inclusive opportunities for deaf people to participate by:

- Working Collaboratively with UK Deaf Sport to:
 - roll out training courses to upskill partners
 - identify and train Welsh based tutors
 - promote sign language resources specifically designed for sport
 - support joint initiatives across the 4 Nations to support the needs of the deaf community
 - support the training of the Welsh workforce including coaches, sport leaders, officials and community volunteer BSL users
- Creating a tri-lingual on-line portal (BSL, English & Welsh) that will assist coaches, sports leaders, officials and volunteers in their everyday delivery of sport and physical activity for deaf people.
- Recruiting a bank of trained community volunteer BSL users who can support deaf people into local sport & activity opportunities.
- Creating 'insport' resources to support deaf sport inclusion amongst all partners Local Authorities, clubs, national agencies, governing bodies of sport and third sector delivery partners.
- Working with Sport Wales Club Solutions and SPORTED to create inclusive deaf sport 'Club Resource Packs'.
- Providing training to Welsh National Governing Bodies Development Officers, Regional Sports Partnerships, Leisure Trusts, Local Authorities and private sector leisure providers on community sport and physical activity inclusive practice.
- Enabling Welsh national governing bodies of sport to be able to support their community clubs to be more inclusive in the delivery of community sport for deaf people.

ENGAGE with deaf people and their networks to promote the benefits of sport & physical activity by:

- Liaising with National groups based in Wales, regional deaf groups, deaf clubs and education to promote health and well-being, sign-posting deaf people to community activity.
- Creating links with Public Health Wales, Regional & Local Public Service Boards, Audiology Units, health and other social care settings.

CONNECT with:

- Schools, Deaf Education Units and FE Colleges to improve access to community sport and physical activity programmes and to support their learning on inclusive practice.
- Street Games, the Urdd, Outdoor Activity Providers, Sports Leaders and Young Ambassadors and other National partners to support their learning on inclusive practice
- Regional Sport Partnerships to deliver inclusive programming which meet the needs of deaf people.
- Welsh Deaf sport specific members, National Governing Bodies of sport, Disability Sport Wales to identify opportunities for community & regional deaf sporting events to be hosted in Wales
- UK Deaf Sport, Disability Sport Wales team and Welsh deaf sport-specific organisations to ensure their programmes are connected and able to support the roll out of activity and programmes suitable for deaf people.

- An active inclusive nation where deaf people regularly participate in sport and physical activity.

RAISING the Game



ENGAGE with deaf people and their networks to promote the benefits of sport & physical activity by:

Promoting awareness of and access to talent pathways and recruitment programmes.

ENABLE our partners to provide inclusive opportunities for deaf people to participate by:

- Establishing a Welsh Performance subgroup.
- Liaising with the Disability Sport Wales to support its Performance Pathway Hub Programme.
- Working with UKDS to signpost talent to its performance and Deaflympics programmes.
- Supporting Welsh National Governing Bodies of sport to include talented deaf athletes and teams within their performance pathways.
- Influencing and prioritising the work of Welsh National Governing Bodies who can contribute to the success of Welsh deaf athletes and teams at future international events, including the Deaflympics 2025, 2027 & 2029.
- Establishing a deaf awareness programme to upskill and increase the number of Welsh regional and national coaches working with deaf athletes and teams.
- Identifying opportunities for regional, national and international deaf sporting events in Wales.



TELLING our story



ENGAGE with deaf people and their networks to promote the benefits of sport & physical activity by:

- Developing a communications plan for the promotion and advocacy of deaf sport in Wales.
- Raising the profile of deaf sport in Wales through an enhanced media presence.
- Showcasing major deaf sporting events (Deaflympics, etc) to promote deaf sport opportunities.
- Working with local and national deaf organisations in Wales to signpost community sport and physical activity programmes and pathways.
- Linking with the deaf clubs in Wales to promote awareness of deaf sport programmes.
- Providing a strong voice for the sports sector on behalf of deaf people in Wales.
- Identifying Welsh role models who can 'tell their story' and raise awareness of the positive impact that sport and physical activity can have.

Informing our **JOURNEY**



ENGAGE with deaf people and their networks to promote the benefits of sport & physical activity by:

- Understanding their current and future needs.
- Setting up a network of user led forums that through influence, skills and experience help support to design, deliver and monitor services and projects.

These will include:

- A strong voice representing the interests of deaf people, their families and support networks
- Young deaf persons forum
- Sports forum

ENABLE our partners to provide inclusive opportunities for deaf people to participate by:

- Using learning and data (e.g. School Sport Survey, National Survey of Wales, DSW & NGB data, sport partnerships and leisure facility data, Governance & leadership good practice etc) to gain a greater understanding of the demand for local activities across Wales to help inform future planning and provision.
- Learning from local and national deaf organisations to better understand national trends and identified needs of deaf people.
- Working with the UKDS Performance subgroup to help inform the future athlete pathways and programmes.
- Working with UKDS to use insight and evidence from the Welsh sporting landscape to inform performance pathways and future Deaflympics planning.



RESOURCING our strategy



- To produce a costed plan for the delivery of the Wales Deaf Sport strategy, which will form the basis of an application to agencies for funding.
- To develop a business case to support applications to funding agencies to fund the appointment of a full time Strategic Lead role to drive the implementation of the Wales Deaf Sport strategy through its first 4 year phase.
- To develop a business plan to support the roll out of education and training courses.
- To prepare the organisation to become ready to explore commercial income by means of sponsorship and other charitable means endeavour.
